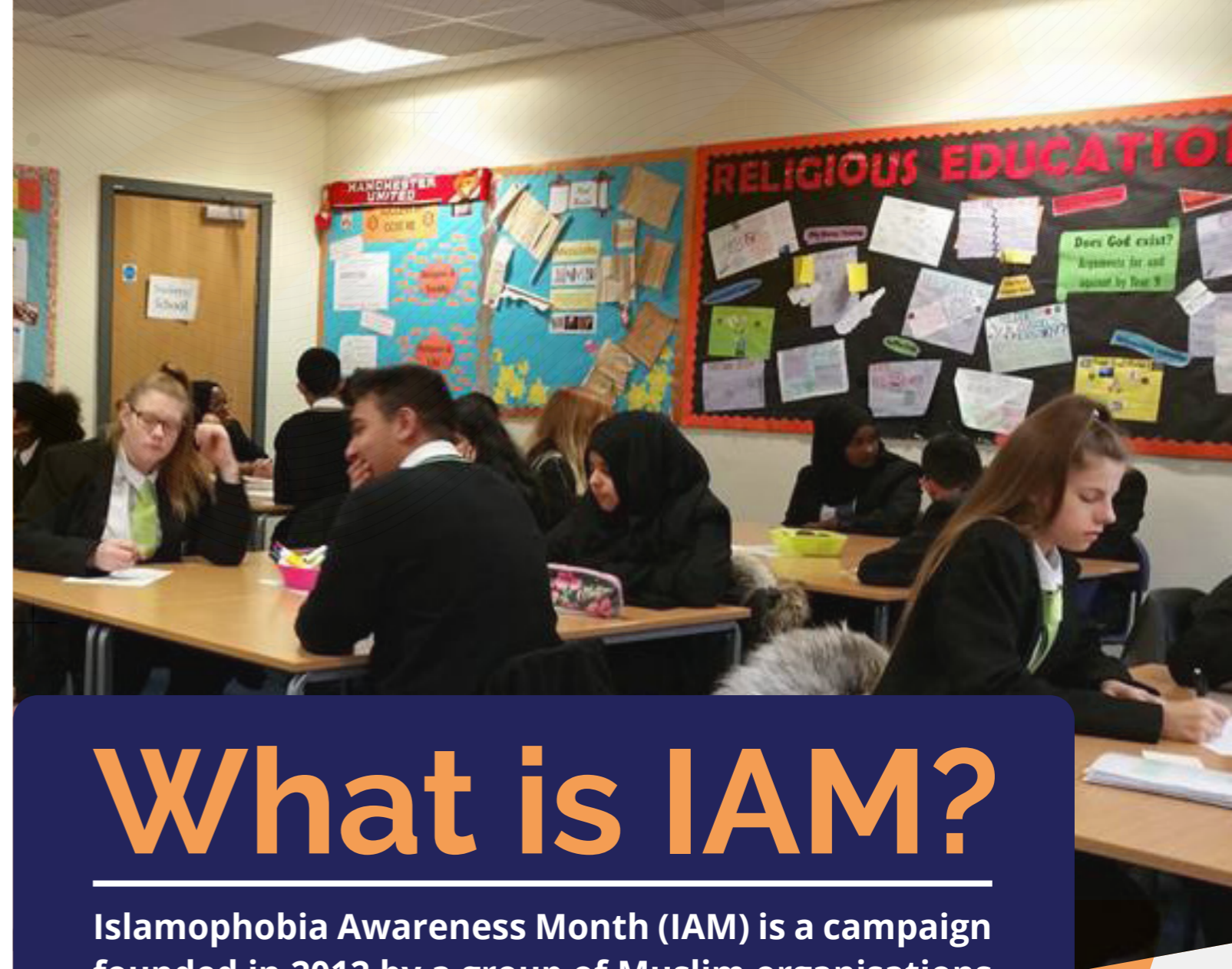

The theme for 2023 is **#MuslimStories**.

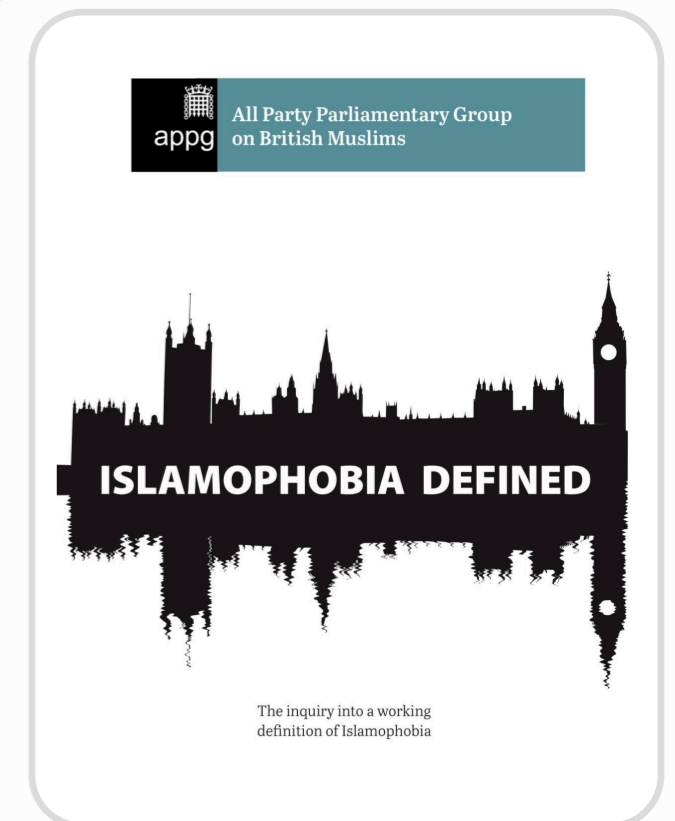
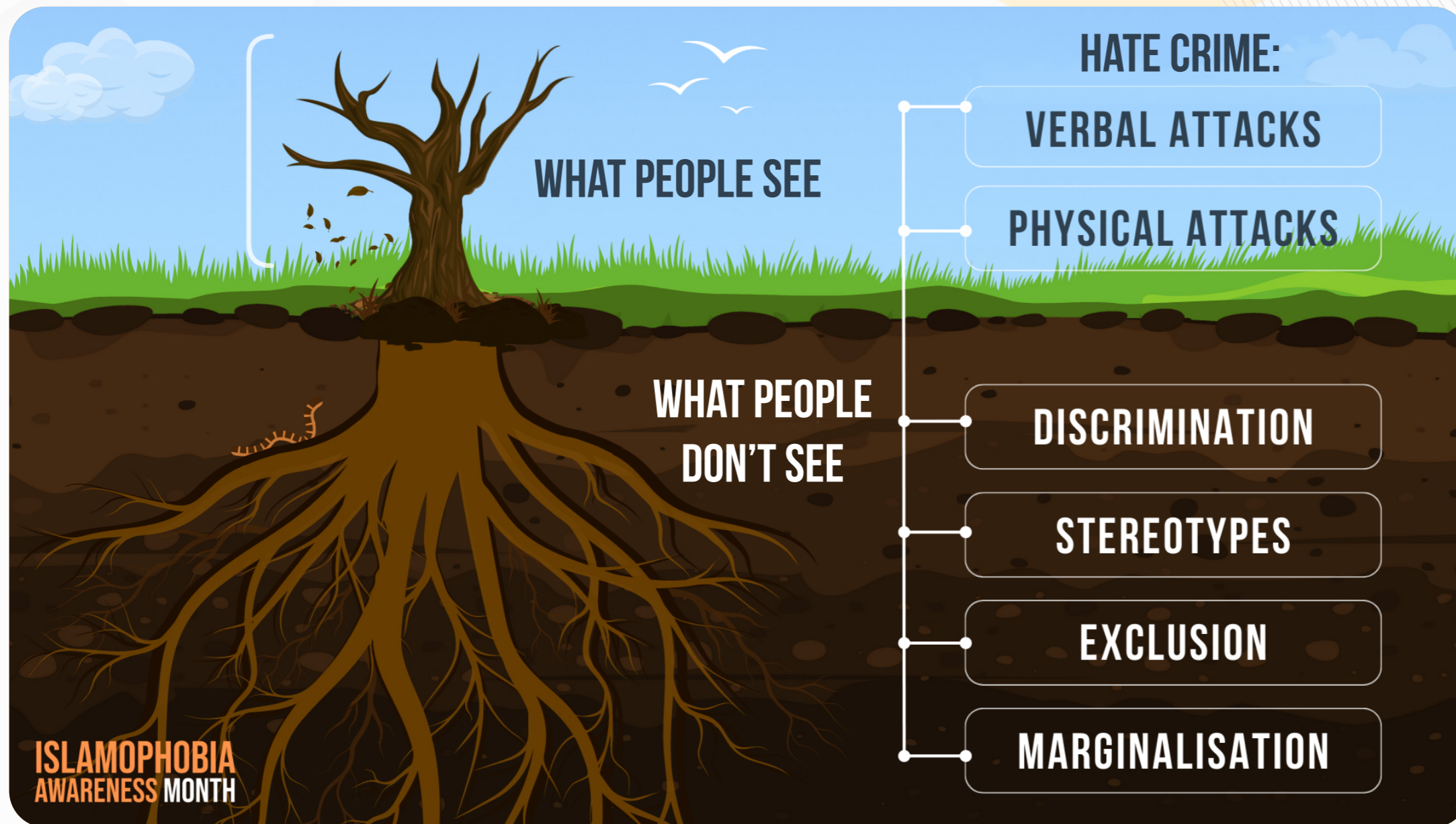
The goal of this year's campaign is to facilitate connections among individuals from diverse backgrounds, including both Muslims and non-Muslims, using the transformative power of storytelling.

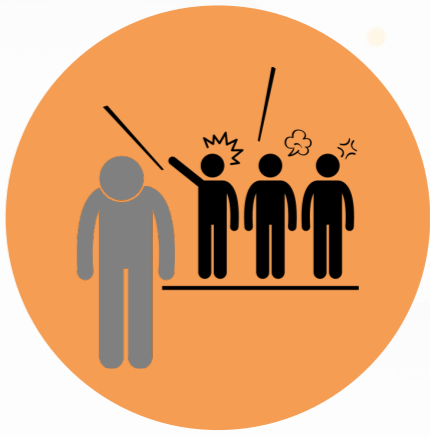

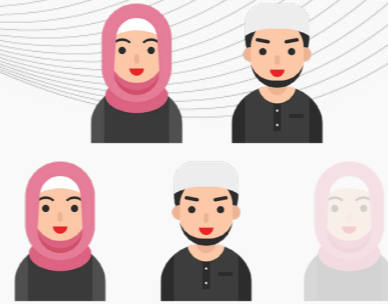

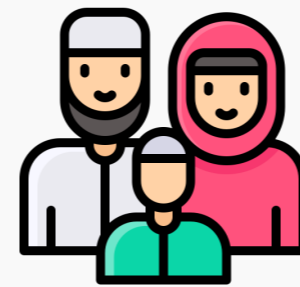
Why does it Matter?



4 in 5 young Muslims say they suffered mental health struggles.

A report¹ conducted by The Better Community Business Network (BCBN) and the University of East London, School of Psychology, looks at the obstacles faced by young Muslims in their battle to maintain their mental health.

The report, which was based on the responses of **729 young Muslims**, reveals that:



60% said they would **not tell their parents** if they had a mental health struggle.

Over 70% of those who say they experience mental health struggles also say that they have been victims of Islamophobia.



90% of service users said it was important for mental health support services to be faith and culturally sensitive.



64% of young Muslims said they experienced **suicidal thoughts**

More than 2/3 of participants experienced bullying (mainly in a public setting). **Over 70%** say bullying occurred in schools.

Bushra Nasir

Bushra Nasir became one of the first Muslim Headteachers of a secondary school in the UK when she was appointed Headteacher at Plashet School in Newham. She worked at the school for 20 years before retiring in 2012. As a strong role model she also wanted to show that part of her identity was related to the culture and the background of Pakistan where she was born, so she wore her shalwar kameez a traditional dress for Pakistani women, to show her heritage.



Thahmina Begum

Thahmina is Executive Headteacher of Community Schools Trust and was previously the Headteacher of Forest Gate Community School (FGCS), judged to be "Outstanding" under the latest EIF framework in 2020. She led the English team at FGCS where progress was the best in the country in 2017 and has consistently been in the top 10 schools ever since. Thahmina hopes her appointment as headteacher will help to inspire young women in the community to aspire to top jobs.



Malala Yousafzai

Awarded with a Nobel Prize at the age of 17, Malala is an international ambassador for human rights. She became a symbol of the fight for girls' education after she was shot in 2012 for opposing Taliban restrictions on female education in her home country of Pakistan.

In 2013, Malala and her father co-founded the Malala Fund to bring awareness to the social and economic impact of girls' education and to empower girls to demand change. She published her first book in 2013, *"I Am Malala: The Story of the Girl Who Stood Up for Education and was Shot by the Taliban."*

THE FAITHS OF THE ABRAHAMIC FAITHS




Islam, Christianity and Judaism are known as the Abrahamic faiths because they trace their common roots to Abraham. They are the world's major monotheistic religions centred on the belief in One God.

The Holy Book of the Muslims, the Qur'an contains references to many prophets that are mentioned in the sacred books of Christianity and Judaism, including Adam, Noah, Moses, David, Solomon and Jesus (peace be upon them all).

The Qur'an refers to Christians and Jews as 'Abi-e-kitaab' or People of the Book and makes various references to the Holy Scriptures given to Moses (the Torah) and Jesus (the Bible), reinforcing the common thread of all these religions, monotheism.

Other common beliefs between the religions include a belief in Angels, the Devil, heaven and Hell, the Day of Judgement, and bearing witness to faith through acts of prayer, charity, love and compassion for others.

Common rituals include eating religiously slaughtered meat, called Halal in Islam and Kosher in Judaism; fasting, during Lent, Ramadan and on Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement); circumcision (in Islam and Judaism) and modesty in dress is practice adhered to by some Christians, Jews and Muslims.
